


LISTEN - Educational Activities to accompany Reaching Out by composer Ileana Perez Velazquez

Listen

Reaching Out was written during the pandemic in 2021 when there still was no vaccine available. Composer, Ileana Perez Velazquez, wrote this piece to express her feelings while she was isolated on an island with her family.

- 1) Listen to the piece and write down what emotions you think Velazquez is expressing? Use the feelings chart below to help list as many as you.
- 2) How does Velazquez convey these emotions musically? (Hint: Listen for sections where the tempo, dynamics, rhythm changes).
- 3) Can you relate to Velazquez' response to the pandemic?

Dig Deeper

Music gives people the opportunity to tell a story. Many composers use music as their medium of expressing their feelings and thoughts. Composer Gustav Holst wrote "Ode to Death" in 1918-1919 in the wake of World War I. He received a medical exemption from military service and survived the war but had close friends who served and died in the horrific combat. Listen to "Ode to Death" and write down what emotions you think Holst is expressing in his piece? What in the music suggests this? (Hint: Listen for instrumentation, dynamics, tempo, rhythm changes).
